



## **Opening Acclamation and Collect for Purity**

secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name;

The Sermon

Following the Sermon, all stand and say The Nicene Creed

The Book of Common Prayer p. 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

### **Prayers of the People**

LEADER: As we celebrate with joy the glorious resurrection of our Lord, let us offer our inter-

cessions and thanksgivings to God:

We pray for the holy Church of God and for its mission, that its divisions may cease, and that it may be filled with truth and love, and bear faithful witness to the Gospel of Christ. Grant that all who have been reborn into the fellowship of Christ's Body may show forth in their lives what they profess by their faith.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for Michael, our Presiding Bishop, for Andy, Jeff, Kai and Hector, our own

bishops; for Mark and Meg, our priests, and for Margaret our deacon; and for all other ministers and for all the holy people of God. Grant that they may be so filled with the power of the resurrection that they may lead us steadfastly in the way that brings

us to everlasting life.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: As your servant Alphege, Archbishop of Canterbury, willing suffered martyrdom by

refusing to permit a ransom for his life to be extorted from his people, grant that all pastors of your flocks may pattern themselves on the Good Shepherd who laid down

his life for his sheep.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow

among nations and peoples. Bring the nations into your fold. Grant that people everywhere listen to the voice of the shepherd who calls each one by name and follow

where he leads.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We remember your servants, Peter and Anna Cassey, who, in the face of slavery and

discrimination, gave the blessings of education and spiritual haven to the marginalized. Grant to us to be fearless in the face of injustice and to work for blessing that

will touch those whom the world does not value.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We remember your servants Father Damien and Sister Marianne Cope, who served

the people on Molokai, bringing hope and consolation to those afflicted with leprosy. Grant that we, encouraged by their good examples, may persevere in running the race

that is set before us until at last we may with them attain to your eternal joy.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for our families, friends and neighbors who live and work in this communty,

especially those who have commended themselves to our prayers, that being freed from anxiety, they may live in joy, peace, and health. Grant that we remain secure in the knowledge that your power working in us can do infinitely more than we can ask

or imagine.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for the relief and protection of the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who

suffer; for refugees, prisoners, and all who are in danger. Open the eyes of our faith

that we may behold you in all your redeeming work.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for all who have died in the communion of your Church, and for those

whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal. Grant that we, who have been raised with Christ, may abide in his presence, and rejoice in the hope of eternal glory.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, blessed Paul and all the

saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life to Christ our God.

PEOPLE: To you, O Lord our God.

CELEBRANT: [Concluding Collect]

**Confession of Sin** 

The Book of Common Prayer p. 360

The Deacon or Celebrant says.

Leader: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept.

**Leader and People** 

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

*Celebrant:* Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. AMEN

The Breaking of the Bread

**CELEBRANT and PEOPLE:** 

(Alleluia.) Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; Therefor let us keep the feast. (Alleluia.)

CELEBRANT: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

We joyfully invite all baptized Christians to join us at the table of our Lord. If you prefer to receive communion in the pews, please let the ushers know. If you do not wish to receive communion, but instead wish to receive a blessing, come forward and stand or kneel at the altar, crossing your arms over your chest.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words:

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. (Amen.) The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. (Amen.)


