The Annunciation



The Gospel of Luke records the angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she would bear the Messiah. Since the fifth century, the Church has commemorated the Annunciation with a feast day, and it is listed as a feast in the 1662, 1928, and 1979 Books of Common Prayer. The Feast of the Annunciation falls on March 25th, exactly nine months before the Church celebrates Christmas. Having such an important feast day fall regularly in the middle of Lent poses a bit of a liturgical conundrum, so when the Annunciation falls in Holy Week or

Easter week (called Bright Week in Orthodox churches...isn't that a great name!), the Feast of the Annunciation is transferred to the first Monday after Easter Week.

The Annunciation is one of the most important feasts of the Church year as it marks two major points: the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Savior and the response of Mary: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." www.stdavidsbythesea.org

St. Mark Feast Day-April 25

The second Gospel was written by St. Mark, who is sometimes referred to as John Mark in the New Testament. Both Mark and his mother, Mary, were well respected in the early Church. Mary's house served as a meeting place for Christians in Jerusalem.

Mark accompanied Paul and Barnabas (Mark's cousin) on their missionary journey through the island of Cyprus. He later accompanied Barnabas alone and we are told that he was in Rome with apostles Peter and Paul. Mark is also attributed with founding the Church in Alexandria, one of the original four main sees of Christianity.

It is believed that Mark wrote the second Gospel while in Rome, sometime before the year 60 A.D. Originally written in Greek to be more easily read by Gentiles converting to Christianity, it is commonly believed that Mark was requested by the Romans to document the teachings of Peter. www.stmarksirving.org


