



The Sermon

Following the Sermon, all stand and say The Nicene Creed

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

LEADER: We pray for the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow

> among nations and peoples. Bring the nations into your fold. Grant that people everywhere listen to the voice of the shepherd who calls each one by name and follow where

he leads.

LEADER: As you blessed your servant Thurgood Marshall with grace and courage to discern and

speak the truth, grant that we, following his example, may know you and recognize that

all humanity are your children.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

LEADER: We pray for our families, friends and neighbors who live and work in this community,

> especially those who have commended themselves to our prayers, that being freed from anxiety, they may live in joy, peace, and health. Grant that we remain secure in the knowledge that your power working in us can do infinitely more than we can ask or

imagine.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

We pray for the relief and protection of the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who LEADER:

suffer; for refugees, prisoners, and all who are in danger. As you led your servant Frances Perkins to envision a society in which all might live in health and decency, help us follow her example to contend tirelessly for justice and the protection of all.

Open the eyes of our faith that we may behold you in all your redeeming work.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy. LEADER: We pray for all who have died in the communion of your Church, and for those whose

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.





Service Notes

Frances Perkins, an American workers' rights advocate (1880-1965), was the first woman to serve in a presidential cabinet. As U.S. Secretary of Labor (1933-1945) she was instrumental in developing policies for social security, for working with labor unions, and dealing with labor issues arising during World War II as women moved into skilled positions formerly held only by men.

Pachomius of Tabenissi, an Egyptian monastic (ca. 292-348), born in Thebes to pagan parents and converted to Christianity in 314, is generally recognized as the founder of Christian community monasticism. He was the author of the first formal monastic rule of life.

Thurgood Marshall, an American civil rights lawyer and jurist (1908-1993), he was a leading force in the effort to end segregation of public schools, culminating in the landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision Brown v. Board of Education. The first African-American to serve as an association justice of the Supreme Court, he served from 1967 to 1991.
