

- LEADER: We pray for the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples.
- PEOPLE: Grant that all those who hold authority in the nations bend their hearts and minds toward seeking justice; honoring the image of God in all humanity; forging mutual respect and understanding between different cultures; and uniting the world in bonds of love.
- LEADER: We pray for the safety of all who serve in local, state, and national police forces and all who serve in any branch of our national armed forces, at home or abroad.
- PEOPLE: Grant that they may live with honor, serve with justice, and protect with mercy in the course of their duties.
- LEADER: We pray for our families, friends and neighbors who live and work in this community. We are concerned for their sorrows and suffering.

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we sing (say):

Celebrant and People Sanctus: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.
(The people stand or kneel.)

Then the Celebrant continues

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never cease to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.


Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith: *Celebrant and People*

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Feast Days

July 8, Priscilla and Aquila (1st Century): Companions of St. Paul and highly valued by him as earnest and effective messengers of the Gospel in Rome and Ephesus.

July 11, Benedict of Nursia, Monastic (c. 543): Generally considered the father of Western monasticism, Benedict's disapproval of the manners and morals of his society led him to a vocation of ascetic renunciation. A community of disciples grew around him, and eventually he composed his monastic rule of life that continues to govern Benedictine monasticism. Under Benedict's Rule, the average day consisted of four hours of liturgical prayer, five hours of spiritual reading, six hours of work, one hour for eating and eight hours for sleeping.

July 14, Argula von Grumbach, Scholar and Church Reformer (c. 1554): Born in 1492 into a noble Bavarian family, she became the first published Protestant woman writer when she wrote a letter in 1523, rebuking theologians of the University of Ingolstadt for forcing a Lutheran tutor to recant and subjecting him to exile and imprisonment. In her letter, she cited over 80 scriptural references and challenged the University to a debate. When the University ignored the letter because she was a woman, she had it printed as a pamphlet which was widely circulated and reprinted in fourteen editions over a period of two months. She continued to publish Reformation writings and became friends with Martin Luther, who wrote to others about her courage.
