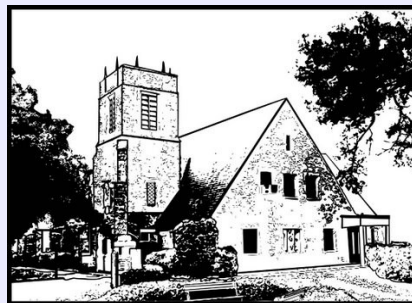

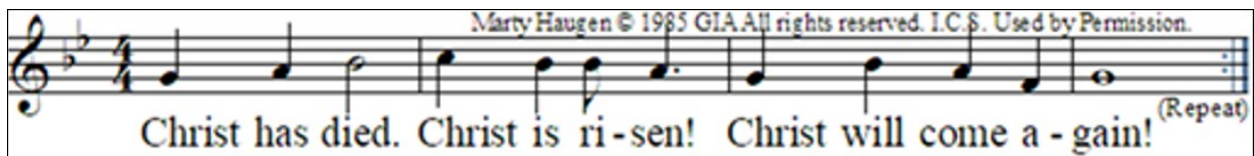
He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.
